MID YEAR REPORTS

Later this term we will be sending home a mid-year report as well as inviting whānau to student led/three way learning conversations in the last week of term. Following your feedback from last year the mid year report will be sent home prior to the meeting. We are in the process of reviewing this mid year report to better align it with our end of year written report. It is important to note that this report only provides an overall teacher judgement in terms of mid year progress in the key learning areas of reading, writing and mathematics, as well as an indication on a 4 point scale of how your child is managing as a learner in relation to identified elements of learning. The richness in terms of your child's progress will be shared and celebrated in the student led/three way learning conversations.

Please know that if a teacher feels a child would benefit from additional support they will be in touch with you. You are also welcome to contact your child's teacher at any time to discuss your child's progress.
